

Project Details

The I2S Corridor is a designated 25km public transport corridor traversing residential expansion areas of Ripley and Redbank Plains (School and Keidges Rd, above).

Acting as a strategic link to Brisbane, the I2S Corridor will close the loop between Ipswich and Springfield with nine potential stations.

This project is a critical element of addressing public transport underinvestment throughout Ipswich. Connectivity between Ipswich and Springfield is inadequate and not meeting community expectations, and growing areas with family-based demographics including Redbank Plains have limited access to public transport.

Council delivered the Strategic Assessment which outlined compelling need for this project to be delivered in line with population growth. It will leverage the investment of Cross River Rail and deliver a 30-minute city and 45-minute region. The I2S Corridor is an early-stage proposal on Infrastructure Australia's Infrastructure Priority List.

About Ipswich

Ipswich is Queensland's oldest provincial city and one of the fastest growing local government areas.

lpswich is under provisioned in public transport, social infrastructure and economically stimulating investment.

By 2041, Ipswich will reach an estimated population of 456,000 with an annual percentage growth rate of 3.4 per cent between 2021 and 2041, more than twice the state (1.4 per cent) and national (1.2 per cent) average.

A city of half a million people requires efficient public transport, social infrastructure, and investment to support economic prosperity and self-sufficiency. This investment is needed now, to address existing issues and ahead of growth to avoid entrenching social and economic inequality.
